has open sightlines to the wall of glass in the back of the house and its views over the water. The kitchen and living room give access to the back terraces, offering easy inside-out entertaining. And the main bedroom features a vaulted ceiling, two large walk-in closets, an office and a private deck with glass railings to keep the views unobstructed. Further up the coastline in Old Lyme is another architect-designed home, this one built by Bruce Beinfield in 1983. The façade takes its cues from Connecticut's classic Colonial, with its 12-over-12 windows, steeply pitched roofline and all-white palette. But the backside, which looks out over Long Island Sound, is a study in cubes and glass, with multiple balconies and a dramatic three-story staircase leading

to a rooftop deck. The massive, lower-level deck offers a pool

and spa and there's also a private wooden walkway leading to the beach. Janet Peckinpaugh of William Pitt Sotheby's International Realty has the \$3 million listing.

## LAKESIDE ESTATE

\$40 MILLION GREENWICH ESTATE OFFERS MULTIPLE WAYS to get wet, along with an impressive, 15,000-square-foot French Normandy main house. Called Topping Hill, it was designed by architect Ralph Mackin and built by Hobbs Construction to feature exquisite materials throughout—hand-cut slate roofs, limestone floors from France and windows framed in bronze. The main house features an indoor 45-foot-long pool with a full-length skylight and sliding doors that make the walls practically disappear in warm weather. Outdoors, along the lake, there's a private dock and a stone boat house. And across the 27-acre grounds you'll also find a Har-Tru tennis court with a pavilion, a formal rose garden, kitchen gardens, flower gardens and rolling meadows.
